






Waste Hierarchy


The aim of the waste hierarchy is to extract the maximum practical benefits from products and to generate the minimum amount of waste.











Carbon Footprint

A carbon footprint has historically been defined as:

- "The total set of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions caused by an organization, event, product or person"
- "A measure of the total amount of carbon dioxide (CO₂) and methane (CH₄) emissions of a defined population, system or activity"

Greenhouse gases can be emitted through

- Transport (food miles)
- land clearance (de-forestation)
- production and consumption of food, fuels, manufactured goods, materials, wood, roads, buildings, and services.

- Reduce
 - Recycled products
 - Fuel efficient vehicles
 - Alternative energy
- Mitigate
 - Plant trees
 - Solar energy
 - Wind power
 - Carbon Capture





Pollution

- Emissions Exhaust, smoke, particulates
- Water Run off, chemicals
- Rubbish litter land fill
- Noise
- Light

Four easy(!) steps

- 1. Split your business up into its component operations
- 2. Assess the 'greenness' of each
- 3. Define improvements
- 4. Categorise them into
 - Do immediately
 - Do later natural replacement
 - Do later planned replacement
